This is an opportunity to explore one of Scotland's oldest designed landscapes in the company of Head Gardener Brian Cunningham, who is a regular guest presenter of the BBC's *Beechgrove Garden* programme. An afternoon walk around the grounds will take us from terraces overlooked by Scone Palace through the shrubbery and flower garden to the 4.5 acre walled garden, currently being replanted, and on to what many consider to be Scotland's finest pinetum, established more than 170 years ago.
